Now in order for Daeng to stay in the USA more than ninety days we had to file for an Adjustment of Status with immigrations.

For her to leave the USA and return she also needed a Travel Permit which takes sixty to ninety days to receive. Since we wanted to return to Thailand again for two months in the fall we had to move along with the process. It was now the middle of July. You do the math.

We returned to Orange County the next day, July 16<sup>th</sup>. We went onto the internet from home. In the Orange County Clerk's Office website we filled out all the paperwork to marry. We made an appointment for the next day at 9:15 AM. When we arrived at the beautiful, original court house in Santa Ana we sat with a gracious lady at her desk in nice leather chairs. She verified the questions we answered on the website application. The experience was a world apart from standing behind the plastic security glass in Las Vegas





She then put on a black gown and in a nice little chapel there in the Clerk's Office, she married us with a double ring ceremony. I think it was more dignified than any of the Vegas weddings I've been to except no Elvis. At the end of the ceremony she gave us the paperwork needed for immigrations and off we went to a life of married bliss.
